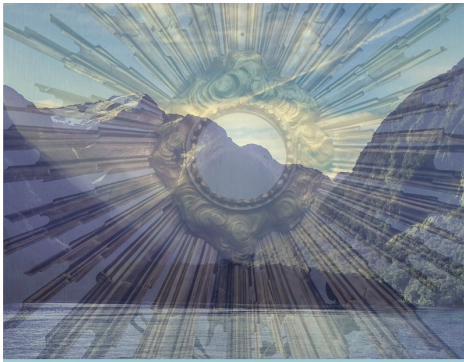

25th Sunday in Ordinary Time

“If anyone wishes to rank first, he must remain the last one of all and the servant of all.”

Mark 9:30-37

October 10, 2021

28th Sunday in Ordinary Time

“Go and sell what you have and give to the poor; you will then have treasure in heaven.”

Mark 10:17-30

August 29, 2021

22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

True worship of God involves *using* the good gifts to benefit the less fortunate. Good stewardship is not optional; it is the hallmark of our faith!

September 5, 2021

23rd Sunday of Ordinary Time

Stewardship is not job-oriented or project-minded. It is a way of life for a lifetime.

September 12, 2021

24th Sunday of Ordinary Time

Sharing our talents arises from the fact that God has given each of us the ability and gifts to do certain things well, and we are to develop those talents for the good of others.

September 19, 2021

25th Sunday of Ordinary Time

Christian Stewardship trains us to become aware that God is the ultimate giver of the gifts we have. To give to God should be “from the top” – not what may be left over.

28th Sunday of Ordinary Time

26th Sunday of Ordinary Time

In a life committed to stewardship we are called to “possess lightly.” Jesus taught

about the dangers of clutching to material possessions and pointed to the real treasures available to us in life.
